We activate partnerships to leverage resources and advance the missions of other organizations. Outdoors for All transcends recreation and truly changes lives.



COLLECTIVE STORIES OF TRIUMPH

The impact of Outdoors for All can only be measured with the collective stories of each individual. The veteran who finds a new path and way to cope through a cycling team. The family who seeks an activity to enjoy together and discovers it on the ski slopes. The child with autism who looks forward to summer camp all year long.

It is a parent watching their child blossom through riding a bike for the first time. It is the independence gained from exercising abilities and forgetting challenges. It is the sensation of self-confidence that spurs from success. It is the simple joys of freedom and fun that arise from physical exercise.

LAUNCHING POSSIBILITIES

Since 1979, Outdoors for All has helped people of all abilities enjoy the mental and physical benefits of an active lifestyle. The expertise of our staff and dedication of our volunteers has allowed us to keep pace and grow with the ever-increasing need for our impactful programs. From our start as a small adaptive skiing group serving 15 kids to the thousands of lives we impact today, Outdoors for All has become a robust organization poised to do more. The diversity of disabilities we support matched with the vast choices of outdoor activities we offer has made

us as a national leader in adaptive and therapeutic recreation for children and adults.

We are proud and humbled by the impact of our work and we know the time to act is now. To meet the growing needs of our community, we are embarking on the **Launching Possibilities Campaign with a goal of \$10M** to build a new community base camp and significantly expand our programs.



A CRITICAL POINT OF CAPACITY

Every year, Outdoors for All is unable to serve thousands of individuals who deserve to experience the joy of outdoor recreation.

We have expanded and stretched to meet the needs of our community but we are now at a critical point of capacity.

Our current physical infrastructure is no longer adequate. Our central offices at Seattle's Magnuson Park, crammed into a former military prison, do not have enough space to grow our team, programs or partnerships. Our current space does not offer the welcoming place our community deserves, one that is fully accessible to people of all abilities.

PARTNERSHIPS

We cannot deliver on the requests from other organizations to add Outdoors for All to their programs.

VOLUNTEERS

We do not have sufficient space to train our essential volunteers, which limits the number of people who make our life enriching work possible.

EQUIPMENT

We have the largest fleet of adaptive cycles that we know of in the country but cannot fit all the equipment in our facilities, causing inefficiencies with maintenance and access.

SATELLITE FACILITIES

Our aging facilities at the Summit at Snoqualmie need critical updates. We lack a more permanent base of operations on the Eastside.

We are eager to continue to meet the rising need for our mission. We know we can and must do more.



45%

45% of our participants report that transportation is a barrier to participating in Outdoors for All's programs.



73%

We are only able to provide summer camp experiences for 73% of the children with disabilities who want to register.



30%

Only 30% of our adaptive cycles are accessible at any given time due to our lack of space.






A BASE CAMP FOR OUR COMMUNITY

The Base Camp will include:

MULTI-USE RECREATION AND EDUCATION ROOM

to accommodate larger groups for volunteer trainings and select indoor program activities such as spin classes, yoga, and day camps

STATE OF THE ART ADAPTIVE CYCLING CENTER to better

utilize our inventory and create a dedicated workshop for maintenance, custom fittings and safety classes

SENSORY FRIENDLY TECHNOLOGIES

throughout the building, such as noise canceling or light dimming amenities, to ease transitions into camps and other programs

COMMUNITY GATHERING

SPACE for our volunteers, participants, and their families to socialize and deepen relationships



A LAUNCH PAD FOR POSSIBILITY

The new base camp will be a launching pad to take our current programming to scale and serve thousands more individuals across the region.
