



Job Title: Adaptive Ski Instructor

Job Summary:

The Outdoors for All team is inviting experienced winter instructors to apply for paid positions this season! If you have 2+ years instructing and/or relevant certifications from organizations such as PSIA-AASI, are willing to commit to teaching at least 2 days/week and meet the requirements outlined in the job description, please submit a resume and introduction to info@outdoorsforall.org.

Responsibilities:

1. Teach private lessons to students using adaptive equipment and techniques at least two days each week
2. Work with students ages 7+ of all abilities
3. Create a safe and fun learning environment
4. Communicate with full time staff regarding student progress, plans, and schedules daily
5. Collaborate and work with volunteer instructors assisting on lessons
6. Be a positive representative and promoter of Outdoors for All programs, events, and activities in our community.
7. Communicate with staff lead regarding risk management issues related to programs to ensure that safety remains the primary goal.
8. Comply with Outdoors for All safety and health policies and procedures.
9. Participate fully as a member of the Outdoors for All staff team.
10. Other duties as identified.

Requirements

1. Must be patient, empathetic, and willing to adapt to different needs
2. Must be able to communicate fluently in English
3. Must be a level 7 skier/snowboarder or higher
4. Must have at least 2 years of teaching experience
5. Ability to lift and carry up to 40lbs, maneuver over uneven surfaces, operate in program environments with adverse weather conditions
6. Must be available to work every weekend throughout the season
7. This position requires both on and off snow time with participants ages 7+
8. Must attend pre-season training December 7&8 and December 14&15. Placement is contingent upon successfully completing training and meeting the minimum skill requirements and safety standards
9. Must be able to work in a team setting and alone
10. Have a strong value for personal safety and the safety of others
11. Passion for teaching snow sports and desire to create inclusion

12. Must own equipment or are able to obtain by completion of training (must pass binding inspection) and own professional-looking gear.
13. Current First Aid card and CPR training (or willingness to obtain within 14 days).
14. Pass Washington state background check.

Preferred qualifications:

1. Preference given to individuals with bi/mono ski knowledge and experience, or the willingness to obtain through training.
2. Preference given to individuals with current PSIA/AASI certification
3. Preference given to those who have experience working with individuals with disabilities
4. Ability to communicate using ASL
