#### NOVEMBER 2023 GALA AUCTION

We hosted our "Rock & Roll" themed Gala Auction November 4th and raised an astounding \$494,649 that supported our adaptive programs.

#### DECEMBER 2023 VOLUNTEER TRAINING

Prior to the start of the ski season, over 400 volunteer instructors gathered for training clinics spread across four days and two mountain resorts. They explored a range of topics, including beginner progressions, teaching techniques, adaptive equipment, and more.

#### **JANUARY 2024**

WINTER PROGRAM KICK-OFF

In January, our seven week series programs for skiling, snowboarding, and snowshoeing kicked off.
Over 200 individuals participated in these programs.
