



Mountain Biking Volunteer

Program Season:

Summer (June - August).

Summary:

Volunteers work one-on-one or in small groups with riders ages 18+ who are able to independently ride a standard or adaptive mountain bike on varied terrain. Outdoors for All partners with the Evergreen Mountain Bike Alliance to provide mountain bike education. Outdoors for All Staff or an EMBA Instructor will lead the mountain bike instruction as a group lesson while the volunteers support the individual riders. Volunteers must meet the requirements below.

Responsibilities:

- Support mountain bike participant 1:1
- Assist with leading participant on trails as instructed
- Provide a safe, fun, positive, helpful learning experience for Outdoors for All participants
- Assist Outdoors for All staff with setup and cleanup of event, which could include moving bikes
- Engage with Participants and provide basic mountain bike instruction under the guidance of the Lead OFA or EMBA Instructor to participants as needed with support of EMBA volunteers and staff
- Help staff care for and properly organize mountain biking gear.

Expectations:

- Age 18 +
- Able to confidently and competently ride a blue mountain bike trail in the state of Washington.
- Must identify as an intermediate rider or of higher skill level with solid trail experience in the past two years.
- Attend and complete all required trainings (specified online)
- Attend at least 3 program days throughout the summer
- Ability and desire to work with a wide variety of personalities, skill levels, and abilities.
- Ability to commit to all responsibilities and expectations
- Pass a Washington State Background check
- Equipment: you will need to have a personal mountain bike and helmet

Training:

- In-person training is required.
